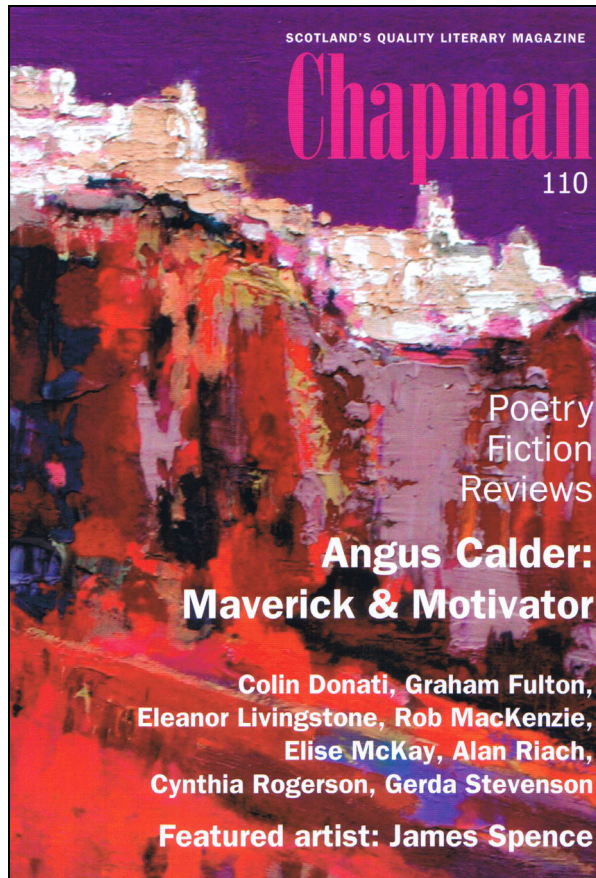


# Chapman 110
